



FOUNDATIONS SENIOR SEND OFF By Anna Murphy Senior at Trinity High School and Foundations Class of 2024

I started participating in the Old St. Patrick's Partners Program when I was in 7th grade. I became extremely comfortable with the faith community at OSP, and I knew, because of my older siblings participation, that I would eventually want to be involved in Foundations.

Our freshmen year of high school left a lot of us restricted to e-learning and our bimonthly meetings were some of our only opportunities to interact with peers in a meaningful way. Our first Worktours that following summer took place exclusively in Chicago, and were almost entirely made up of only our grade. The unique experiences of our freshmen year made our class extremely close and it soon became extremely obvious that we were strong in faith and numbers. We were dedicated to our service and prayer lives and over the years we retained a very large percentage of the people in our grade that started Foundations in 2020.

Throughout the years we participated in four retreats that would teach us about our faith, each other, and the world around us. We attended more Worktours to Memphis, New Orleans, Beattyville, Birmingham, Cincinnati, and St. Louis. We followed the rule of "croissants, not bagels," and left spaces in our conversations to allow more voices. We looked for God in the "thin places" where we could see beyond the human world, took "short lines" whenever there were undesirable tasks, and "tried new things" at every Foundations event.

On a more personal note, Foundations has been an extremely special place for me and the senior class feels like an extra family. The people I have met because of Foundations have taught me what God looks like, whether they have been the other Foundations members, the volunteers working at the organizations we partner with, or the people that we serve. As I look ahead towards this summer, our Worktour to Kentucky, and my college years beyond it, I will struggle to say goodbye to the community we have created over the last four years. However, I know that my experiences will remain with me forever, motivating me to serve others and grow in my faith.

Important Information:

- First Communion typically takes place when a child is in 2nd grade. OSP requires one year of Religious Education PRIOR to registering for First Communion. If that has not been met, please sign your child up for 1st grade.
- Reconciliation typically takes place in 3rd grade.
- Confirmation is a two year process. The preparation begins in Fall of 7th grade and Confirmation will take place in the Spring of their 8th-grade year.

PLEASE NOTE: In sacramental years (2nd, 3rd and 7th) of Partners, the cost for one child is \$400 (\$325 plus a \$75 sacramental fee. The fee for Foundations is \$400 (\$325 plus a \$75 Foundations Fee). For all other grades, the fee is \$325.) If you are registering more than one child, please use the discount code "additionalchild" for the 2nd, 3rd or 4th child. Once that code is entered, the amount for each child will be \$150 or \$225 if in a sacramental year.

SOS...SOS...SOS

To all of our OSP members: The Immigrant & Refugee Ministry needs your help. Again... Still!

As most of you know, we have been working with newly arriving Venezuelan families since last summer. There have been six families to date. We have shared many of their stories on this page. Our first task is always to find them a place to live. Then our volunteers prepare the apartment. This often involves some cleaning. Then we put away all the great household goods that so many of you have donated – dishes in the cabinet, towels in the bathroom, sheets and blankets on the beds. And speaking of beds, that is where our partnership with the Chicago Furniture Bank comes in – our source for gently used furniture and new mattresses. AND, they deliver!

Just before the family is to move in, our volunteer grocery shoppers head to the store to make sure there is food in the fridge and in the pantry, before our new neighbors arrive. Because of your generosity, we can do all of this AND pay their first six months' rent. Without that resource, imagine trying to convince a landlord that you just got here, have little or no money, and no job. Not going to happen.

A soon as we get them settled and introduce them to their family liaisons, the process of finding them a job is paramount. Refugees arrive with permission to work; asylum-seekers face a challenging process to get that permission. We have most recently been wading into the weeds on that one. Fortunately, one OSP member came forward to share opportunities at the company he worked with, and some placements happened.

If you know the story of how the city of Chicago grew, burned down, and grew again, you should also know that was possible due to generations of hard-working immigrants. That's why Lin Manuel Miranda had that great line in Hamilton: "Immigrants get the job done!"

Right now, we have 3 gentlemen, all in their 30s, and all with previous work experience in their home country (some have found odd jobs here in the US) who are looking for full time jobs.

One already has his work documentation in hand, the others have applied online and are waiting for theirs. All are fathers who dreamed of a home for their families that offered jobs so they could provide food, education and clothes for them. Saint Hilary of Arles

Saint of the Day for May 5, 2024

It's been said that youth is wasted on the young. In some ways, that was true for today's saint.

Born in France in the early fifth century, Hilary came from an aristocratic family. In the course of his education he encountered his relative, Honoratus, who encouraged the young man to join him in the monastic life. Hilary did so. He continued to follow in the footsteps of Honoratus as bishop. Hilary was only 29 when he was chosen bishop of Arles.

The new, youthful bishop undertook the role with confidence. He did manual labor to earn money for the poor. He sold sacred vessels to ransom captives. He became a magnificent orator. He traveled everywhere on foot, always wearing simple clothing.

That was the bright side. Hilary encountered difficulty in his relationships with other bishops over whom he had some jurisdiction. He unilaterally deposed one bishop. He selected another bishop to replace one who was very ill–but, to complicate matters, did not die! Pope Saint Leo the Great kept Hilary a bishop but stripped him of some of his powers.

Hilary died at 49. He was a man of talent and piety who in due time, had learned how to be a bishop.

Saint Hilary teaches us to respect authority even if found in a young person. Age is not the issue: prudence and wisdom are.



Sunday Parking:


