

WHAT CAN YOU DO FOR RMIGRANTS — TODAY, TOMORROW, OR NEXT MONTH

On May 19, the feast of Pentecost this year, the Holy Spirit was active among the many volunteers who sat at tables in Huges Hall so that OSP members could learn about the many ministries of Old St. Pat's church community. A number of people, who stopped by the Immigrant and Refugee Ministry (IRM) table, asked what they could do to help.

Here are some of the answers they received:

- 1) If you don't mind **attending meetings**, or even enjoy them, you can join the 20+ IRM members who gather monthly to discuss the work of the IRM, hear about the progress of the migrant families we are supporting, and plan the next steps in this important work. Just contact us at immigration@oldstpats.org and ask to get your name on the mailing list for meetings.
- 2) You could **become a family liaison**, someone who volunteers to get to know one of our families better than a committee can. These are people our family can call with questions like: Where can I find a dentist? How do I sign up my children for school? Can someone drive me to the doctor? My family needs clothes, so what church has an "immigrant clothes closet"? Or where is the nearest food pantry?
- 3) How do we meet our families? Generally, we receive referrals for other organizations, especially **Catholic Charities and The Heartland Alliance**
- 4) You could **shop for groceries** for a migrant family that is being supported by The Heartland Alliance, an active partner organization of the IRM. They provide you with a shopping list and suggestions of ethnic grocery stores where you can find the food items a family is accustomed to.
- 5) When we find an apartment for one of our families, you could **help with apartment setup**. This entails working with other volunteers in arranging furniture in the future home of one of our migrant families, cleaning, making the beds, hanging towels in the bathroom, putting dishes in the kitchen cabinets, and food in the fridge. In other words, you are part of a process that makes a migrant family "feel like they are home."
- 6) And where does the furniture come from? Mostly from the **Chicago Furniture Bank (CFB)**. OSP/IRM joined the CFB so we can go to their warehouse, full of donated furniture that is in good shape, and select what is needed for a specific family. And, THEY DELIVER!
- 7) And where do the dishes and pots and pans come from? Periodically, the IRM hosts a **household goods collection** event where OSP members can donate things like coffee pots and toasters, and those towels for the bath. If you have donated in the past, THANK YOU. Just watch the bulletin for the next one.
- 8) If you are a student of Chicago history, you know that immigrants built this city before the Great Fire, and rebuilt it afterwards. To eventually prosper in the US, **immigrants need jobs**. If you know of an opening, please contact the IRM at our email address
- 9) **Learning English**. Better jobs come with better English. Are you a teacher, now or before you retired? Does a one-on-one connection with a migrant appeal to you as a way to serve? Then we have places for you to do this, with assistance from professionals. For example: Aquinas Literacy Center 1751 W, 35th Street, 773-927-0512, or Erie Neighborhood House, 1347 W. Erie and 4225 W. 25th St., call 312-666-3430 and ask for Susana Ortiz.
- 10) **We are grateful.** There is a continuous need to write Thank You notes to our donors. To help in this way, contact Krista Chinchilla at kristac@oldstpats.org.

Did you know if you are aged 70 ½ or older?

You can make a gift from your individual retirement plan (IRA) that benefits you and Old St. Pat's. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) allows individuals aged 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to Old St. Pat's, tax-free.

It's easy: Simply provide your IRA administrator with Old St. Patrick's EIN: 36 – 2171102 and request a QCD distribution.

THERE ARE THREE MAIN BENEFITS OF GIVING WITH A QCD

- 1. If you are 73 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required IRA minimum distribution.
- 2. The amount transferred directly to Old St. Pat's does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- 3. Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.

Important Information:

- First Communion typically takes place when a child is in 2nd grade. OSP requires one year of Religious Education PRIOR to registering for First Communion. If that has not been met, please sign your child up for 1st grade.
- Reconciliation typically takes place in 3rd grade.
- Confirmation is a two year process. The preparation begins in Fall of 7th grade and Confirmation will take place in the Spring of their 8th-grade year.

PLEASE NOTE: In sacramental years (2nd, 3rd and 7th) of Partners, the cost for one child is \$400 (\$325 plus a \$75 sacramental fee. The fee for Foundations is \$400 (\$325 plus a \$75 Foundations Fee). For all other grades, the fee is \$325.) If you are registering more than one child, please use the discount code "additionalchild" for the 2nd, 3rd or 4th child. Once that code is entered, the amount for each child will be \$150 or \$225 if in a sacramental year.



SUMMER ONLINE MEDITATION CHAPEL CENTERING PRAYER: A CHRISTIAN PATH OF TRANSFORMATION

The birth of centering prayer took place about 50 years ago, in the 1970's. It happened at St. Joseph Abbey in Spencer MA where Fr. Thomas Keating was abbot of a small group of Trappist monks. This was shortly after both Vatican II had breathed its fresh air into the Catholic Church and shortly after the cultural revolution of the sixties. Down the road from St Joseph Abbey a Franciscan retreat center had recently closed its doors and was purchased by a group of Buddhists who started the Insight Meditation Center. This resulted in an increase of traffic to St. Joseph Abbey from people who were asking directions to the Insight Meditation Center. Keating took notice and began to ask as people came to the door, what was it that they were really looking for aside from directions. And they answered a practice or a path ... they were looking for a way to transform their consciousness and change the way they lived in the world.

Most of these people turned out to be Christian, many Catholics, so Keating would ask why are you not looking for a path in your own tradition ... to which the response was, never knew Christianity had a path or practice for transformation! For most people, Christianity had become a religion of believing the right things, which at the end of the day, if we are honest, transforms very little. It is from these experiences that Keating issued his famous challenge to the Trappist monks he was living with ... is it not possible to put the essence of the Christian contemplative path into a meditation method accessible to modern people living in the world? Our 2,000-year tradition has so much more to offer than most Christians realize.

The meditation method as Centering Prayer was born. Keating moved to Snowmass CO and by the 1980's thousands of people were traveling to Snowmass to attend Centering Prayer retreats at St. Benedict's Abbey. All this activity and energy around CP led to a primarily lay led, grassroots membership organization being born, called Contemplative Outreach. Father Keating and Contemplative Outreach have given those of us who are Christian a path/practice of transformation within the devotional and theological structure of our own religious tradition. Whether you want to stick your toe in the water or jump in the deep end, this summer Old St. Pat's online prayer chapel invites you to explore this Christian path of transformation. There is no cost or obligation, register here. You will be kept informed about each week about what is happening in the chapel and can plug in where you feel drawn.

Saint Ephrem

Saint of the Day for June 9, 2024

Poet, teacher, orator, and defender of the faith, Ephrem is the only Syriac Christian recognized as a doctor of the Church. He took upon himself the special task of opposing the many false doctrines rampant at his time, always remaining a true and forceful defender of the Catholic Church.

Born in Nisibis, Mesopotamia, he was baptized as a young man and became famous as a teacher in his native city. When the Christian emperor had to cede Nisibis to the Persians, Ephrem fled as a refugee to Edessa, along with many other Christians. He is credited with attracting great glory to the biblical school there. He was ordained a deacon but declined becoming a priest. Ephrem was said to have avoided presbyteral consecration by feigning madness!

He had a prolific pen, and his writings best illumine his holiness. Although he was not a man of great scholarship, his works reflect deep insight and knowledge of the Scriptures. In writing about the mysteries of humanity's redemption, Ephrem reveals a realistic and humanly sympathetic spirit and a great devotion to the humanity of Jesus. It is said that his poetic account of the Last Judgment inspired Dante.

It is surprising to read that he wrote hymns against the heretics of his day. He would take the popular songs of the heretical groups and using their melodies, compose beautiful hymns embodying orthodox doctrine. Ephrem became one of the first to introduce song into the Church's public worship as a means of instruction for the faithful. His many hymns have earned him the title "Harp of the Holy Spirit."

Ephrem preferred a simple, austere life, living in a small cave overlooking the city of Edessa. It was here that he died around 373.

Many Catholics still find singing in church a problem, probably because of the rather individualistic piety that they inherited. Yet singing has been a tradition of both the Old and the New Testaments. It is an excellent way of expressing and creating a community spirit of unity as well as of joy. An ancient historian testifies that Ephrem's hymns "lent luster to the Christian assemblies." We need some modern Ephrems—and cooperating singers—to do the same for our Christian assemblies today.


