

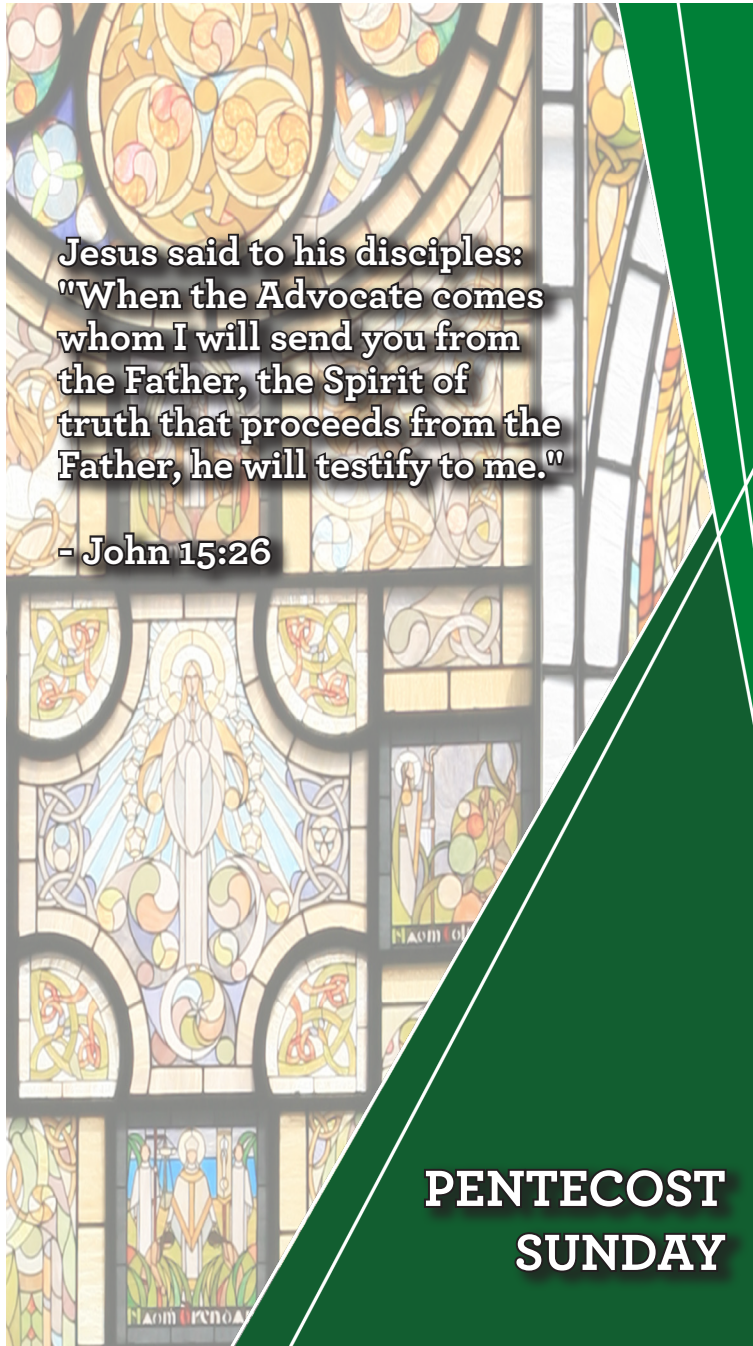

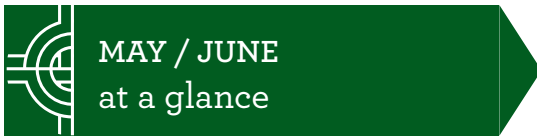

Something that I have grown to appreciate through conversations with my co-workers is the mindset that Pentecost is “a celebration of mission.” In today’s Gospel, we see the disciples hidden away in the Upper Room. They are fearful of the unknown, and anxious about what’s ahead. When the resurrected Jesus appears to them, they are commissioned, sent out, to a life of service, ministry, and care. Pentecost is the end of the Easter season, and regarded as the birthday of the Church, but it can be more personal than that.

I think that the idea of “mission” is something that I often know in my head, but not always in my heart. At a church like OSP, mission permeates through everything we do. In the homilies, it is clear how we should live out the Gospel message, and volunteer opportunities have a breadth of influence to cover many interests and social justice concerns. However, when I’m faced with taking that next step, I find myself feeling like the disciples before seeing Jesus, a little overwhelmed and disoriented.

“As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” The message of Pentecost hits home for me as the beginning of the Foundations Youth Ministry worktour cycle approaches. I don’t think that you necessarily need to attend a service trip to live a mission oriented life ...but any excuse to brag about my teens and their wisdom works for me! Throughout the summer, we will load up our vans and head all around the country. A cornerstone element of worktour is the willingness to step into someone else's experience. I learn a lot from the teens and the unique ways that they do this.

While working with Habitat for Humanity, we met families who were experiencing housing insecurity and heard about their path towards home ownership. Through this experience, the teens reflected deeply on human dignity and respect. Mission also involves a continual invitation to know people better and to be known in return. I see this in the ways that the teens eagerly meet new people. Whether it be within the worktour group, or especially in conversation with those we encounter throughout the week, we hear stories, share in joy, and sometimes carry pain. This openness allows for common humanity to overcome the barriers that we often let stop us from making true connections. The bottom line is this: we cannot be ourselves without each other.

On this Pentecost Sunday, I think it would be valuable to take the time and celebrate the moments of mission of your own life, but to also listen to that tug on your heart to take the next step. May we always strive to be a little bit more collaborative, thoughtful, and service oriented. When we take it one moment at a time, our lives really can be lived as an active pursuit of the greater good.

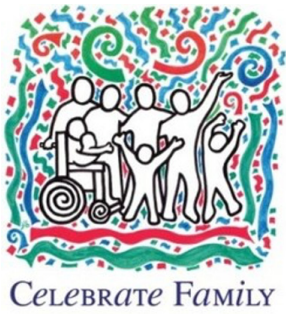


FIRST COMMUNION CLASS OF 2024

Important Information:

- First Communion typically takes place when a child is in 2nd grade. OSP requires one year of Religious Education PRIOR to registering for First Communion. If that has not been met, please sign your child up for 1st grade.
- Reconciliation typically takes place in 3rd grade.
- Confirmation is a two year process. The preparation begins in Fall of 7th grade and Confirmation will take place in the Spring of their 8th-grade year.

PLEASE NOTE: In sacramental years (2nd, 3rd and 7th) of Partners, the cost for one child is \$400 (\$325 plus a \$75 sacramental fee. The fee for Foundations is \$400 (\$325 plus a \$75 Foundations Fee). For all other grades, the fee is \$325.) If you are registering more than one child, please use the discount code "additionalchild" for the 2nd, 3rd or 4th child. Once that code is entered, the amount for each child will be \$150 or \$225 if in a sacramental year.

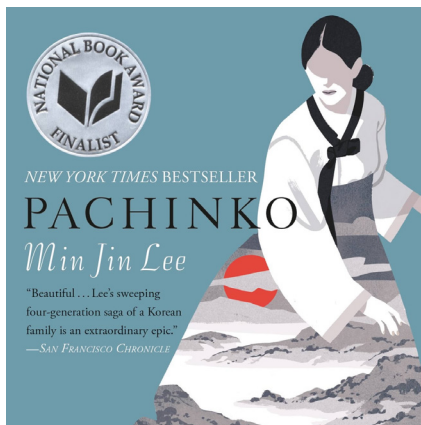

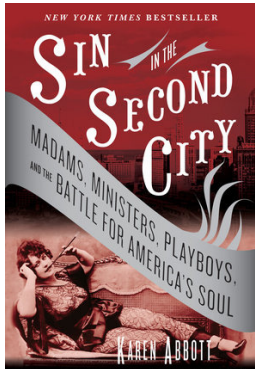
OSP Book Club is meeting Sunday May 19 from 10:30 am to noon in the third floor library of the 711 Building.

Hi everyone. It's Mike Nykaza. My mom, Marge Nykaza, was a long-time parishioner at Old St. Pat's, and she had a heart for the hurting. She also loved music. So a few years ago, she started a nonprofit called Harmony, Hope & Healing. HHH's mission is to heal individuals and families through the healing power of music. Each year, HHH serves over 800 individuals and hosts over 200 classes in the Chicagoland area. In August of last year, my mom passed away at the young age of 69. Now, HHH is in need of our help.

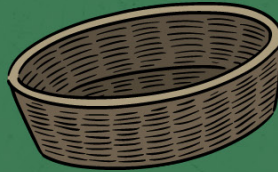

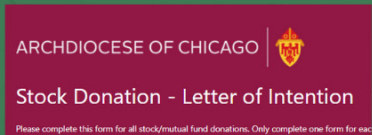

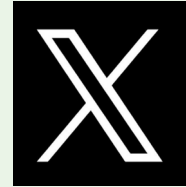

Saint Theophilus of Corte

Saint of the Day for May 19, 2024

If we expect saints to do marvelous things continually and to leave us many memorable quotes, we are bound to be disappointed with Saint Theophilus. The mystery of God's grace in a person's life, however, has a beauty all its own.

Theophilus was born in Corsica of rich and noble parents. As a young man, he entered the Franciscans and soon showed his love for solitude and prayer. After admirably completing his studies, he was ordained and assigned to a retreat house near Subiaco. Inspired by the austere life of the Franciscans there, he founded other such houses in Corsica and Tuscany. Over the years, he became famous for his preaching as well as his missionary efforts.

Though he was always somewhat sickly, Theophilus generously served the needs of God's people in the confessional, in the sickroom, and at the graveside. Worn out by his labors, he died on June 17, 1740. He was canonized in 1930.

There is a certain dynamism in all the saints that prompts them to find ever more selfless ways of responding to God's grace. As time went on, Theophilus gave more and more single-hearted service to God and to God's sons and daughters. Honoring the saints will make no sense unless we are thus drawn to live as generously as they did. Their holiness can never substitute for our own.

Sunday Parking:

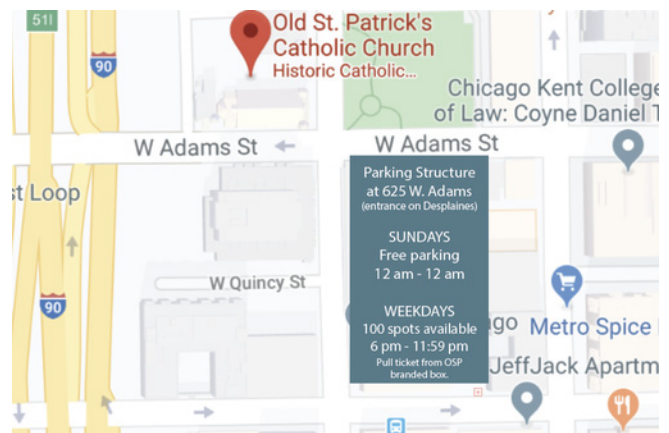
